## SPACE PRESERVATION ACT OF 2001

We commend reading the complete text of Representative Dennis Kucinich (D-Ohio) for the "Space Preservation Act of 2001" which was introduced into the House of Representatives on October 2, 2001.

This Bill, HR 2977, states as it purpose:

"To preserve the cooperative, peaceful uses of space for the benefit of all humankind by permanently prohibiting the basing of weapons in space by the United States, and to require the President to take action to adopt and implement a world treaty banning space-based weapons."

Although HR 2977 was not passed into law, the content of this Bill is an authoritative exposition of military capabilities which use the Earth's atmosphere. One example is in Section III:

## Section III

- (2)(B) Such terms include exotic weapons systems such as-
  - (i) electronic, psychotronic, or information weapons;
  - (ii) chemtrails;
  - (iii) high altitude ultra low frequency weapons systems;
  - (iv) plasma, electromagnetic, sonic, or ultrasonic weapons;
  - (v) laser weapons systems;
- **2)(C)** The term 'exotic weapons systems' includes weapons designed to damage space or natural ecosystems (such as the ionosphere and upper atmosphere) or climate, weather, and tectonic systems with the purpose of inducing damage or destruction upon a target population or region on Earth or in Space."
