



Epidemiologist Steve Wing discusses increases in cancer rates after the Three I

Dr. Steven Wing's talk is about the long-term health effects to human, animal, and plant life in the aftermath of the Three Mile Island accident.

Arnie Gundersen was a senior executive in the nuclear industry with over twenty years experience. Mr. Gundersen holds two Masters degrees in Engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. In 1990 he came forward as a whistleblower. Over the next several years, his case got a great deal of attention, and he testified before Congress to protect whistleblowers. Mr. Gundersen is now a prominent nuclear safety expert witness.

Steven Wing teaches epidemiology at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill and conducts research in environmental health. Since 1988 he has collaborated on epidemiological studies of radiation exposure near nuclear weapons plants. His 1997 and 2003 articles published in Environmental Health Perspectives describe the impact of the nuclear accident at Three Mile Island on cancer rates near the plant. His recent studies examine the impact of environmental injustice.
