**WEATHER MODIFICATION:
 Salted Clouds Pour More Rain on Mexico**

The science of weather modification has been moribund for the last 2 decades, as practically nothing was working in experiments intended to increase precipitation, and scientists didn't understand what was happening in the little work that showed any promise. Now, a glimmer of hope out of South Africa by way of Mexico has researchers guardedly upbeat again. Water-attracting salt grains have been shown to wring more water from reluctant rain clouds in a Mexican experiment.
