JWM - Call for Papers

Workers in the area of weather modification are invited to submit technical papers and reports describing their work for publication in the 2006 volume of the Journal of Weather Modification. Papers may be submitted to the reviewed section if they are scientific or technical, and support their conclusions with rigorous observations, computations, and analysis. These papers will be reviewed by peers with the possibility of further modification in light of peer reviewers' comments before acceptance and publication. Papers also may be submitted to the non-reviewed section if they are of a less technical nature. They may be suitable for the non-reviewed section, for instance, if they represent administrative reports of weather modification activities of interest to other workers, if they contain interim results concerning ongoing research, or if they present sound arguments supporting new ideas in the field.

Draft papers for the reviewed section should be prepared electronically in Microsoft Word or Word Perfect format for Windows, double-spaced, and provided **to the Editor by 15 December 2005** for adequate review prior to the next April publishing date. **Draft papers or Notes for the non-reviewed section** should be prepared electronically in Microsoft Word or Word Perfect format for Windows, double-spaced, and provided **to the Editor by 15 January 2006**. *Please send all papers as an e-mail attachment to Editorial Assistant Connie Crandall (Connie.Crandall@sdsmt.edu).*

Pages charges are \$50 for each black-and-white published page, and \$120 for each color published page.
