# Spare the Air in the San Francisco Bay Area



The 2011/2012 Winter Spare the Air season runs from November 1 through February 29.

Each day by 2 p.m., the Air District will issue an <u>air quality forecast</u> for the next day. If air quality is forecast to be <u>unhealthy</u>, a *Winter Spare the Air Alert* will be called. The alert will be in effect the entire next day, for a full 24 hours.

# During a Winter Spare the Air Alert, the use of fireplaces, pellet stoves, wood stoves, fireplace inserts and outdoor fire pits is illegal.

The Air District will also call <u>Recommended No-Burn Days</u> in an effort to reduce levels of fine particles, or soot, and to prevent the need to call mandatory *Winter Spare the Air Alerts* that ban wood burning.

During the winter season, wood smoke is the largest source of harmful <u>soot pollution</u>. On this website, residents can find information about the <u>health effects of wood smoke</u>, as well as detailed information about the <u>Wood Burning Rule</u> and how to <u>comply with it</u>. Here are answers to some <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> about the Winter Spare the Air program.

You can also file a wood smoke complaint online.

#### **Check Before You Burn**

To find out if a *Winter Spare the Air Alert* is in effect, residents and business owners who own or use any indoor or outdoor fireplace, fire pit or wood or pellet stove can do the following:

Combine trips or eliminate one altogether. Your car emits more pollution when you start your car after it has been sitting for about an hour. By grouping your errands, you reduce the 'cold starts'; plus you'll save gas and time by eliminating extra trips.
