You have requested a letter from our District indicating our support to allow emergency water transfer from Millview CWD through the Calpella CWD into Redwood Valley CWD.

The Board of Directors at their last regular board meeting of March 12, 2014 indicated no objections to allowing emergency transfer of water through our District to Redwood Valley, as long as there were no financial or operational impacts upon the District.

It is our understanding the Redwood Valley intends to create a new intertie with our water system to facilitate this transfer. Before any work on any portion of our system is started Redwood Valley will need to provide complete details and obtain written approval from Calpella CWD.

It was also noted at the board meeting that Calpella CWD assumes no legal responsibility for these transfers and we understand that Redwood Valley CWD will obtain all necessary permits and approvals for these transfers.


Subject: Inter-tie connection and emergency water supply

Dear Board of Directors,

This letter is in response to your request for assistance and an emergency water supply for the duration of the drought we are currently experiencing. The Millview County Water District has negotiated the use of an alternative water supply that will provide up to 400 gallons per minute for domestic use in Redwood Valley. The District engineer is currently working on the design and construction plans for approval at the April 15, 2014 Board meeting and application to the California Department of Public Health to amend our water supply permit adding the supply as an approved drinking water source will be submitted next week.

The District will supply the Redwood Valley water District with up to 400 gallons per minute for domestic use upon completion of the needed upgrades.
